Boy Scout Troop 50 CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY

To avoid the potential for conflict of interest,

- 1. Parents and siblings of a Scout may not sign off on his rank requirements.
- 2. Parents and siblings of a Scout may not sign off on his merit badge blue cards. (There will be one exception – for non-Eagle required merit badges, if there is only one merit badge counselor in the Troop for a particular merit badge, that counselor may sign off his son's merit badge blue card if the counselor teaches that merit badge to his son and other Scouts in a classroom setting.)
- 3. Parents and siblings of a Scout may not conduct his Scoutmaster conferences.
- 4. Parents and siblings of a Scout may not conduct his Board of Reviews.
- 5. Parents and siblings of a Scout may not be his ASM advisor (for a leadership role).
